

#3 Daniel 7:8 – What Happened on July 8, 1776, to fulfill Daniel 7:8

Key Understanding: *The “mouth speaking great things” on July 8, 1776. The July 4, 1776, Declaration of Independence was first read publicly, in Philadelphia, by Colonel John Nixon, of the ancestral family of U.S. President Richard Nixon (more on that story later), on July 8, 1776, in fulfillment of Daniel 7:8, the rise of the Little Horn Nation of America, with “a mouth speaking great things.”*

*Daniel 7:8 (KJV) I considered the [ten] horns, and, behold, there came up among them another **LITTLE HORN**, before whom there were **THREE OF THE FIRST HORNS** plucked up by the roots: and, behold, in this horn were eyes like the eyes of man, and **A MOUTH SPEAKING GREAT THINGS** [referring to the Declaration of Independence and its meaning and doctrines, first read publicly by a mouth on 7/8, in fulfillment of Daniel 7:8].*

The first public reading of the Declaration of Independence was by John Nixon and occurred at high noon on July 8, 1776, in the Old State House yard in Philadelphia.
