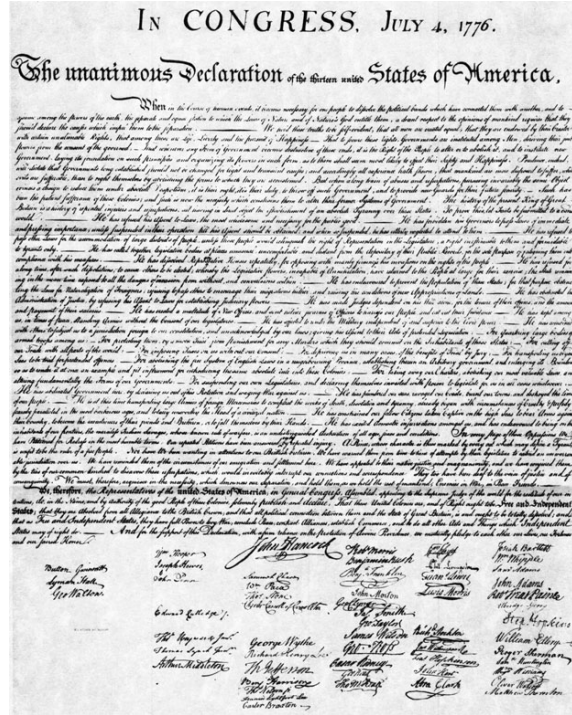


#4 Col. John Nixon vs. Jesus with Nicodemus – Mouths Speaking Great Things

Key Understanding: The words of Jesus Christ vs. the words of John Nixon. The July 4, 1776, Declaration of Independence was first read publicly by a man named Nixon (Colonel John Nixon) because the root from which the name Nixon is derived is the same as the root of the name Nicodemus, in John 3. Each is attached to the Greek Nike, meaning victory.

But while Nixon and Nicodemus are related to one another etymologically, the Lord’s real purpose in ordaining it as such is that Col. John Nixon was “a mouth speaking great things” in Daniel 7:8, while Jesus Christ was a mouth speaking great things to Nicodemus in John 3. Unsealing #5 contrasts the “great things” each was speaking.

*Daniel 7:8 (KJV) I considered the [ten] horns, and, behold, there came up among them another LITTLE HORN, before whom there were THREE OF THE FIRST HORNS plucked up by the roots: and, behold, in this horn were eyes like the eyes of man, and **A MOUTH SPEAKING GREAT THINGS** [referring to the Declaration of Independence and its meaning and doctrines, first read publicly by a mouth on 7/8, in fulfillment of Daniel 7:8].*
