

#180 Making the World Safe for Democracy – The Presbyterian President

Woodrow Wilson. Thomas Woodrow Wilson was born in Staunton, Virginia, on December 28 or 29, 1856. He always gave December 28 as his birthday, but the Wilson family Bible indicates that he was born at 12:45 a.m. on December 29. His ancestry was Scottish and Scotch-Irish.

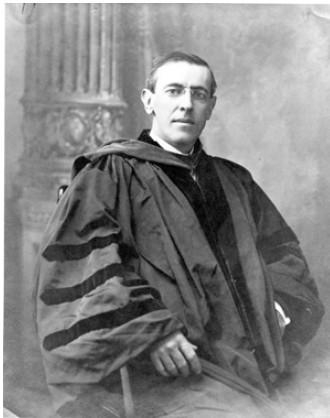


Woodrow Wilson's mother, Janet Woodrow, was the daughter of a Presbyterian minister. Wilson's father, Joseph R. Wilson, was also a Presbyterian minister. Although originally from the Midwest, he was a founder and leader of the southern branch of the Presbyterian Church in the United States. In 1857 the Wilsons moved to Augusta, Georgia. In 1870 they moved to Columbia, South Carolina, where Wilson's father became a professor in a Presbyterian theological seminary.



Woodrow Wilson was born to Joseph Ruggles Wilson, a Presbyterian minister, and Janet Woodrow Wilson (*pictured*) in Staunton, Virginia, on December 28, 1856. The couple also had two older daughters at the time of Woodrow's birth, and a second son was born after the family moved to Augusta in 1858.

The Woodrow Wilson Family Home is the only house the Wilson family ever owned. When the family arrived in Columbia in 1870, they intended to make the city their permanent home. Thomas Woodrow Wilson spent his teenage years here, a period that had a profound influence on his political views.



Woodrow Wilson became President of Princeton University in 1902.

Woodrow Wilson attended Princeton, then known as the College of New Jersey, the fourth oldest institution of higher learning in the U.S. Only Harvard, William and Mary, and Yale are older. Princeton was originally sponsored by the Presbyterian Church. The first classes were held in the home of Jonathan Dickinson, a Presbyterian minister who served as the college's first president. Wilson later became President of Princeton University, a position that launched him toward the governorship of New Jersey in 1910, followed by his election as the President of the United States in 1912.

In the meantime, as was covered earlier in Unsealing [#164 The World War I Second Ascension of America – The Marriage of Ivan the Terrible to a Rome woman, and the Marriage of Woodrow Wilson to a Rome woman](#), Woodrow Wilson married Ellen Louise Axson, whose father had been a Presbyterian minister in Rome, Georgia.

Key Understanding: *The Presbyterian president.* The Lord chose a man well known for his Christian faith, Presbyterian Protestant Woodrow Wilson, to be President of the United States during World War I, to represent the 8th Kingdom, the United States of America, as it fully received its mantle as the *Fourth Rome*. This is because the United States was receiving a *religious-political* mantle from the Third Rome, and was also receiving the *religious-political* mantle as the *Fourth Christian Roman Empire of its day*, but for the purpose of Making the World Safe for Democracy, vs. the Autocracies of the day. ‘Men of War for Democracy’ and Christianity were entirely woven together.

Remember, World War I was birthing both the 7th Kingdom USSR, and the *Second Ascension* of the 8th Kingdom U.S. . . .
