

#233 The Ten Horns of Revelation 13:1 – In the United States of America, the people are King

The Crowns are shifted from the Seven Heads of Autocracy in Revelation 12:3 to the Ten Horns of Democracy in Revelation 13:1.

Revelation 13:1 (KJV) And I stood upon the sand of the sea[shore], and saw A [Daniel 7:8 Little Horn] BEAST RISE UP OUT OF THE SEA, HAVING SEVEN HEADS AND TEN HORNS, and UPON HIS [Ten] HORNS TEN CROWNS, and upon his heads the name of blasphemy.



Key Understanding: In the United States of America, the people are King. The point is being made that the Ten Horns of Revelation 13:1 represent the Crown Shift from Autocracy to Democracy, and are seen through the birth of ‘Little Horn’ America, and the advent of the December 15, 1791, Bill of Rights. The Crown Shift essentially represents the shift from kings being kings to “the people” being kings. U.S. Senator (W. Va.) Robert Byrd’s Independence Day remarks on July 3, 2006, certainly make the point.



[West Virginia U.S.] Senator [Robert C.] Byrd delivered these remarks at the City of Charleston's annual Independence Day Celebration. The Senator was the keynote speaker at the event, at the invitation of Mayor Danny Jones and the Charleston [West Virginia] City Council. The city's celebration took place on Monday, July 3 [2006].

We gather tonight to commemorate a defining historical moment. For it was on July 4, two hundred thirty years ago, that members of the Second Continental Congress adopted the final draft of the Declaration of Independence, and the world’s greatest experiment in government began.

In 1787, after a half dozen years of laboring under our country’s first Constitution, the flawed Articles of Confederation, a new Constitution, one that would stand as a beacon to man’s best hopes across the ages, was born. It is that same Constitution that governs our great country today, and the first words of its Preamble are, “We the people . . .”

Three simple words, “We the people,” set forth the bedrock principle for the most radical and revolutionary form of government ever to illuminate the human mind. Under our system, the people are sovereign. In the United States of America the people are King. The government serves at the people’s pleasure.

Think of it - - citizens as sovereigns. What an earth-shaking approach to managing the earthly affairs of men!
