

#615 Salem Rebellion, Salem Witchcraft – Continuing with more Doubles of (1) the Mathers’ Boston Rebellion of 1688-1689 and (2) the American Boston Rebellion of 1775-1776, part 3, The site of Increase Mather’s House became the site of Paul Revere’s House

The colonial home of Paul Revere during the time of the American Revolution occupies the former site of the Mather parsonage of the *Congregational* Old North Church (referring to Second Church, or North Church, of Boston). Increase Mather, minister of the Old North Church (Second Church), and his family, including his son, Cotton Mather, occupied this parsonage from 1670 until it was destroyed in the Great Fire of 1676. The original three-story house which would become the home of Paul Revere was then built circa 1680. Revere owned the home from 1770 to 1800.

Key Understanding: *Revere lived at the site of the Mather parsonage. The two lanterns in the steeple of the Anglican Old North Church that signaled Paul Revere and others that the British were coming also signaled the start of the Revolutionary War. The Lord ordained that Paul Revere would live at the former site of the Increase Mather parsonage of the Congregationalist Old North Church at the beginning and throughout the Revolutionary War. This was to further confirm the doubles of (1) the Mathers’ Boston Rebellion of 1688-1689 and (2) the American Boston Rebellion of 1775-1776.*

*1 Samuel 15:23 (KJV) **FOR** [1688-1692 Mather] **REBELLION** [in conjunction with the Glorious Revolution/English Bill of Rights of 1688-1689] **IS AS THE SIN OF** [1688-1692 Boston-Salem] **WITCHCRAFT**, and stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry. Because thou hast rejected the word of the LORD, he hath also rejected thee from being king.*
