

#887 Benjamin Franklin and America as Babel – Why the U.S. Constitution was signed on September 17, 1787, part 1, The counterfeit of Isaiah 9:6, the Government Shall Be Upon His Shoulder

The U.S. Constitution was signed by 39 of the 55 delegates on September 17, 1787. Less than three months after the Constitution was signed, Delaware became the first state to ratify it, on December 7, 1787. New Hampshire was the ninth state, putting the Constitution into effect on June 21, 1788. The Bill of Rights was added on December 15, 1791.


Key Understanding: *The counterfeit of the government upon the shoulder of God. The establishment of the government of the United States as supposedly “One Nation Under God” upon the earth has always been a counterfeit of the Lord’s millennial kingdom. Specifically, the Lord ordained the U.S. Constitution to be signed on September 17, 1787, birthing America’s government, to serve as a counterfeit of Isaiah 9:6 [9:6 + 11 = 9:17 = September 17], the messianic verse about the Son of God’s millennial kingdom, when “the government shall be upon his shoulder.”*

*Isaiah 9:6-7 (KJV) For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given [the first part of this verse has to do with the First Coming of the Son of God, Jesus Christ]: and THE GOVERNMENT SHALL BE UPON HIS SHOULDER [and this part of the verse has to do with the Second Coming of the Son of God, Jesus Christ]: *and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. 7 Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will perform this.**


September 17, 1787
