

#974 The Whore's Latter Rain – In 605 B.C., Nebuchadnezzar's Babylon registered a Pair of Victories over (i) Egypt at the Battle of Carchemish, and (ii) Judah, for the purpose of connecting to the future Revelation 6:05 Black Horse Rider, part 3, The doubles surrounding Nebuchadnezzar's Pair of Victories in 605 B.C.

Revelation 6:5 (KJV) And when he had opened THE THIRD SEAL, I heard the third beast say, Come and see. And I beheld, and lo A BLACK HORSE; and he that sat on him had A PAIR OF BALANCES IN HIS HAND.

Key Understanding: *The doubles surrounding Nebuchadnezzar's pair of victories in 605 B.C. The Lord designed a number of doubles to be associated with Nebuchadnezzar's pair of victories over Egypt and Judah in 605 B.C., for the purpose of illustrating that the events would be prophetically connected to the future Revelation 6:05 Black Horse Rider, with its strong doubles theme of a "pair of balances in his hand." Here is a list:*



(i) Double Kingdoms (see the map below)

Assyria and Babylon – Assyria and Babylon have always been historically paired because both kingdoms were in the region of Mesopotamia. In fact, Nineveh and Babylon, the respective capital cities of each of those kingdoms, were located in what is modern day Iraq.

(ii) Double Defeats and Captivities, which end in 605 B.C.



Assyria defeated the northern kingdom, Israel, in 722 B.C. and carried them away. Babylon defeated the southern kingdom, Judah, in 605 B.C. and carried some away.

(iii) Double Sieges of Judah/Jerusalem

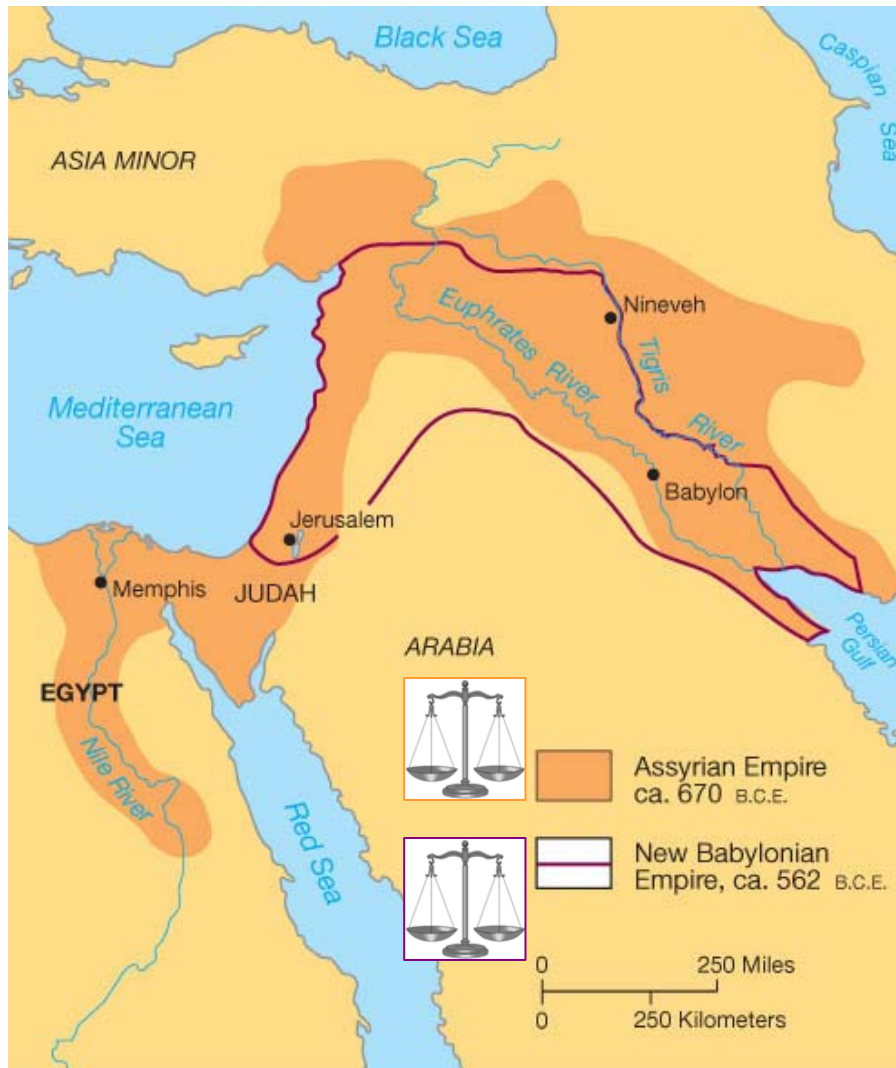


Sennacherib's Assyria besieged Jerusalem in about 701 B.C., but was ultimately unsuccessful.

Nebuchadnezzar's Babylon besieged Jerusalem in 605 B.C., and was successful.

(iv) **Double Victories by Nebuchadnezzar in 605 B.C., over Egypt and Judah**

Nebuchadnezzar defeated **Egypt** in 605 B.C. at the Battle of Carchemish. Nebuchadnezzar then defeated **Judah** and Jerusalem in 605 B.C.
