



**#1192 The Patmos Revolution – The Birthplaces of Democracy: The ‘Bacchus’s Vine’ 2nd American War for Independence and September 14, 1814, and the ‘Bacchus’s Vine’ Greek War for Independence and September 14, 1814**

The title of this Unsealing is similar to the title of Unsealing [#1188](#), which was The American Revolution and September 14, 1814, and the Greek Revolution and September 14, 1814.

**Key Understanding:** The main objective of both Unsealing [#1188](#) and this Unsealing was/is to note the doubles as concerns *American Democracy* and *Greek Democracy*.

- **September 14, 1814.** September 14, 1814, the “dawn’s early light” of “The Star-Spangled Banner,” is one of the most memorable and significant dates associated with the War of 1812. September 14, 1814, is a date that is also associated with the birth of the Greek Revolution against the Ottoman Turks.
- **Wars for Independence.** The War of 1812 had the secondary name of the 2nd American War for Independence, while the Greek Revolution has historically had the secondary name of the Greek War for Independence.
- **Birthplaces of Democracy.** Greece was the original birthplace of Democracy circa 500 B.C. The United States of America is the birthplace of Democracy and the Cradle of Liberty for the world in the last days. In that sense, America is a *second* Greece. The Lord used the date of September 14, 1814, to bring together the two birthplaces of Democracy.
- **A 2<sup>nd</sup> for America and a 2<sup>nd</sup> for Greece.** The War of 1812 represented the 2nd American War for Independence. Keeping in mind the fact that Greece was the original birthplace of Democracy, the Greek Revolution of March 25, 1821, represented a 2nd time period of Greek Democracy, though Greece was ruled by kings after it gained its independence from the Ottoman Turks.

What the Lord uses to *specifically* illustrate the connection between the two is “The Star-Spangled Banner,” the tune of which was (and is) that of “To Anacreon in Heaven,” which honored Bacchus’s Vine.

- **Bacchus’s Vine.** “The Star-Spangled Banner” connected the American Revolution and the War of 1812 to Bacchus’s Vine, which spiritually/prophetically represented ancient Greek *Democracy*. Thus, **Bacchus’s Vine represents ancient Greek Democracy and modern American Democracy as the Vine of the Earth**. On September 14, 1814, America was gaining ‘Bacchus’s Vine’ Greek-style Democracy, while Greece was birthing its independence from the Ottoman Turks.

The key question will be . . . Why did the Lord ordain that one of the three men who birthed the Friendly Company to overthrow the Turks be from the island of Patmos, where John was given Revelation?

*Revelation 1:9 (KJV) **I JOHN**, who also am your brother, and companion in tribulation, and in the kingdom and patience of Jesus Christ, **WAS IN THE ISLE CALLED PATMOS**, for the word of God, and for the testimony of Jesus Christ.*
