

**#1217 America as Media-Persia – The relationship between the Daniel 5:27 “. . . thou art weighed in the balances” and the Revelation 6:5 “. . . a pair of balances in his hand”**

**Balances.** The word *balance* is used eight (8) times in the King James Version, while the word *balances* is used ten (10) times in the King James Version. Of the ten (10) times *balances* is used, two (2) of those times directly relate to the theme of Media-Persia defeating Babylon.

**Key Understanding: *Thou art weighed in the balances.*** In Daniel 5:27, “. . . *thou art weighed in the balances*” was fulfilled by Media-Persia conquering Babylon, while in Revelation 6:5, “. . . *a pair of balances in his hand*” was fulfilled by the *second* Media-Persia, the United States, defeating the *pretender second* Nebuchadnezzar, Saddam Hussein.

**Daniel 5:27, “. . . thou art weighed in the balances” – Media-Persia conquers Babylon**

*Daniel 5:25-28 (KJV) And this is the writing that was written, MENE, MENE, TEKEL, UPHARSIN.*

*26 This is the interpretation of the thing: MENE; God hath numbered thy kingdom, and finished it.*

*27 TEKEL; THOU ART WEIGHED IN THE BALANCES, and art found wanting.*

*28 PERES; Thy kingdom is divided, and GIVEN TO THE MEDES AND PERSIANS.*



**Revelation 6:5, “. . . a pair of balances in his hand” – the second Media-Persia (America) conquers the pretender second Nebuchadnezzar and pretender second Babylon, Saddam Hussein and his regime in Iraq**

*Revelation 6:5 (KJV) And when he had opened THE THIRD SEAL, I heard the third beast say, Come and see. And I beheld, and lo A BLACK HORSE; and he that sat on him had A PAIR OF BALANCES IN HIS HAND [representing the judgment by the *second* Media-Persia – the United States – upon the *pretender* Revelation 17 Scarlet Beast Soviet Union and the *pretender second* Nebuchadnezzar and the *pretender* Revelation 18 Babylon the Great, Saddam Hussein and his regime in Iraq].*
