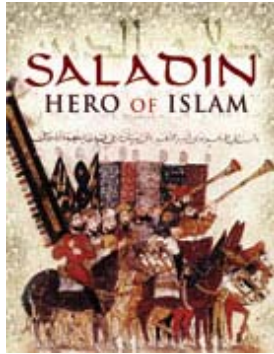


**#1391 America as Media-Persia and the Building of Israel – Defeating Saddam Hussein, who wanted the role of Saladin, part 3, Because Saddam Hussein was compared to Saladin, who captured Jerusalem on behalf of Islam in 1187, the defeat of ‘Saladin’ Saddam is automatically prophetically tied to the theme of the building of Jerusalem and Israel on behalf of Jews and Christians**



**Key Understanding: ‘Saladin’ Saddam and Jerusalem. Because Saddam Hussein was compared to Saladin (a comparison aided by the fact that both were born in Tikrit), who had captured Jerusalem from Christians in 1187 for Islam, the defeat of ‘Saladin’ Saddam is automatically *prophetically* tied to the theme of the building of Jerusalem and Israel on behalf of Jews and Christians. It then became *historically* tied to the building of Jerusalem and Israel because it (the defeat of ‘Saladin’ Saddam) led to the September 13, 1993, accord between the PLO and Israel.**
