

#1440 (Re)building the Walls of the *Christian* New Israel and the *Jewish* new Israel – The *first* American Nehemiah: John Winthrop, part 2, Nehemiah and the Babylon Stump; Winthrop and the Babylon Stump

Review: John Winthrop is known in history as an “American Nehemiah.” The biblical Nehemiah journeyed to rebuild the Walls of *Jerusalem*, while John Winthrop, the American Nehemiah, journeyed to build *Salem* – the name for ancient Jerusalem – and Boston, as “Cities Upon a Hill.”

Nehemiah 2:17 (KJV) Then said I [Nehemiah] unto them, Ye see the distress that we are in, how JERUSALEM LIETH WASTE, and the gates thereof are burned with fire: come, and LET US BUILD UP THE WALL OF JERUSALEM, that we be no more a reproach.

Review: In the series The Boston Stump (Unsealings #623–#631) it was learned that just as the Nebuchadnezzar Stump in Daniel 4 points to the restoration of Nebuchadnezzar, the unseen Babylon Stump of Daniel 5 points to the restoration of Babylon – in the form of Babylon the Great, of course. America as “the Boston Stump” – with roots in the Boston Stump church in Boston, England – is the Boston-Babylon Stump, representing the restoration of the unseen (Daniel 5 Belshazzar) Babylon Stump and its roots.

Daniel 5:22 (KJV) And thou his [Nebuchadnezzar’s] son [descendant, actually grandson], O Belshazzar, hast not humbled thine heart, though thou knewest all this;

Key Understanding: *Linking Nehemiah and John Winthrop, the American Nehemiah, through the Babylon Stump.* While Nehemiah’s journey from Susa to rebuild the Walls of Jerusalem was connected with Media-Persia’s defeat a century earlier of Nebuchadnezzar’s and Belshazzar’s Babylon – which left an unseen Babylon Stump (Daniel 5) – John Winthrop’s journey from England as the American Nehemiah to build Salem as a “City Upon a Hill” represented the *restoration* of that unseen Babylon Stump through the Boston Stump church in England – laying the foundation for the building of Babylon the Great.
