

#1478 The Abomination of Desolation – The *Unholy* Temple of the *Christian* New Israel (the Body of Americans) joined with the *Jewish* new Israel (the Body of Israelis) is *unholy* because it is built by *earthly* kingdom-minded Men o’ War, and is a major fulfillment of the Abomination of Desolation

Key Understanding #1: The *Unholy* Temple of the *Christian* New Israel (the Body of Americans) joined with the *Jewish* new Israel (the Body of Israelis) is *unholy* because it is built by *earthly* kingdom-minded Men o’ War, and is a major part of the fulfillment of the desecration of the Temple, which is attached to the Abomination of Desolation.

*1 Chronicles 28:3 (KJV) But God said unto me [King David], **THOU SHALT NOT BUILD AN HOUSE** [Solomon’s Temple] **FOR MY NAME, BECAUSE THOU HAST BEEN A MAN OF WAR, AND HAST SHED BLOOD.***

*Matthew 24:15 (KJV) **When ye therefore shall see THE ABOMINATION OF DESOLATION, spoken of by Daniel the prophet, stand in the holy place,** (whoso readeth, let him understand:)*

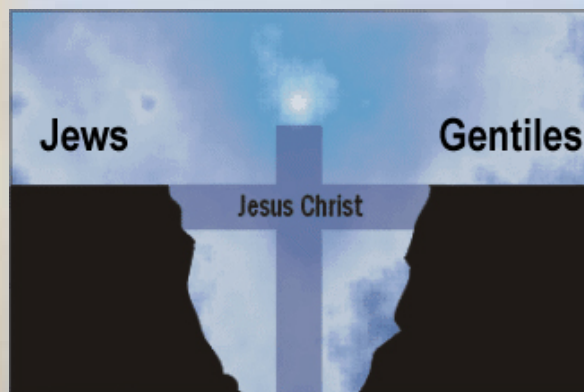
Key Understanding #2: There is a combination of historical events that fulfills the prophecy of the Abomination of Desolation, though the same general theme of the desecration of the Temple is the underlying story of the Abomination of Desolation.

Key Question: The key question is this . . . Is the Abomination of Desolation of Matthew 24:15, which is attached to the desecration of the Temple, speaking of and/or referring to a rebuilt Temple in Jerusalem – a third Temple that would follow Solomon’s Temple and Zerubbabel’s/Herod’s Temple, that is, . . .

. . . a Temple made with hands and dead stones, which was the primary meaning of “the Temple” in the Old Testament –



or is it speaking of the living stones Temple of the New Testament, that is, the Church of Jesus Christ as the living stones Temple of the living God?
