

#1498 The role of the A-bomb in the Abomination of Desolation – The *sound* association of A-bomb and Abomination



Key Understanding: *The sound association of A-bomb and Abomination.* The shortened name for an atomic bomb – such as the August 9, 1945, Pu-239 atomic bomb dropped on Nagasaki, Japan – became *A-bomb*. The meaning of *A-bomb*, of course, is not linguistically tied to the meaning of the word abomination. However, even though the understanding of the prophetic role of the atomic bombs – especially the August 9, 1945, Pu-239 Media-Persia atomic bomb – as an Abomination of Desolation in the restoration of Israel as the Third Temple stands on its own, the Lord nonetheless uses the *sound association* of A-bomb (with its silent *b*) with Abomination to point to the Abomination of Desolation.



Let's use this opportunity to look at the meaning in *Strong's Concordance* of each of the words of abomination and desolation.

Matthew 24:15 (KJV) When ye therefore shall see THE ABOMINATION [#946, from #948, in *Strong's Concordance*] OF DESOLATION [#2050, from #2049, in *Strong's Concordance*] [in conjunction with the Third Temple being constructed through the joining together of the Man o' War 'Living Stones' *Christian* New Israel (the Body of Americans as the Third Temple) and (with) the Man o' War 'Living Stones' *Jewish* new Israel (the Body of Israelis as the Third Temple)], spoken of by Daniel the prophet, stand in the holy place, (whoso readeth, let him understand:)
