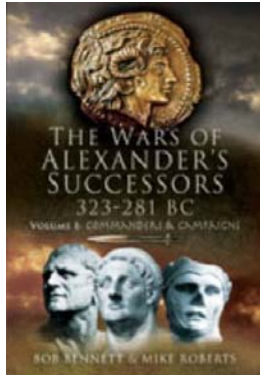


**#1566 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The series of 4’s (fours) from Alexander the Great to Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 2b, The Four Diadoch Wars (continued)**

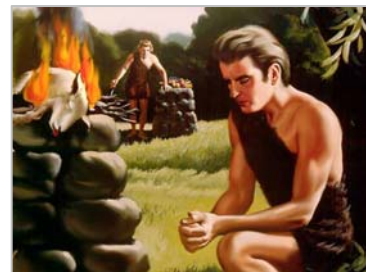


**Key Understanding: *The four Diadoch wars.* There were 4 (four) Diadoch Wars that were fought between the successors of Alexander the Great, known as the *Diadochi*. The wars are historically called the First Diadoch War, the Second Diadoch War, the Third Diadoch War, and the Fourth Diadoch War. The 4 (four) Diadoch Wars are a part of the history surrounding the Abomination of Desolation and its link with 4’s (fours), going back to Genesis 4:4.**

*Genesis 4:3-5 (KJV) And in process of time it came to pass, that Cain brought of the fruit of the ground an offering unto the LORD.*

**4 AND ABEL, HE ALSO BROUGHT OF THE FIRSTLINGS OF HIS FLOCK AND OF THE FAT THEREOF. AND THE LORD HAD RESPECT UNTO ABEL AND TO HIS OFFERING:**

*5 But unto Cain and to his offering he had not respect. And Cain was very wroth, and his countenance fell.*



Here is #1566–Doc 1, another document about **the Diadochi** and **the four Diadoch Wars**. As was the case in the previous Unsealing, the purpose of going through this article is *not* to examine it in detail, but to simply note the listing of four wars fought between the Diadochi. The outline of the wars in this document differs slightly from that of the document in the previous Unsealing. Here is a condensed version of the document’s outline of the four Diadoch Wars:

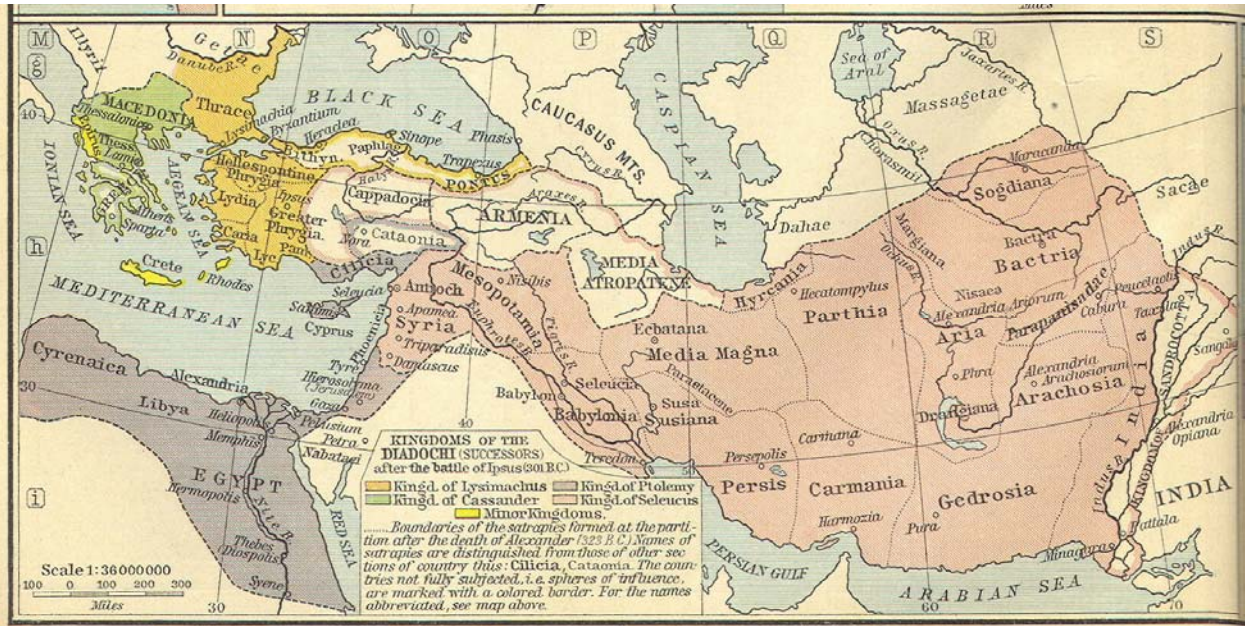
- **First War of the Diadochi, 322-320 B.C.**
- **Second War of the Diadochi (west), 319-317 B.C.**
- **Second War of the Diadochi (east), 319-315 B.C.**
- **Third War of the Diadochi, 315-311 B.C.**
- **Fourth War of the Diadochi, War I, 307-306 B.C.**
- **Fourth War of the Diadochi, War II, 306-301 B.C.**

It is suggested that the first (main) two paragraphs of the document (before the outline) be read. Note the mention of the Diadochi fighting **“four full-scale wars.”**

[The document then says that the result of the 4 (four) Diadoch Wars, reached by 300 B.C., was a division of Alexander the Great’s Empire into *three* large parts, which more or less coincided with Alexander’s possessions in Europe, Asia, and Egypt. Historians, however, agree that directly after the Battle of Ipsus in 301 B.C., which concluded the four wars of the Diadochi, the former empire of Alexander the Great was divided primarily into *four* parts, which will be discussed in more detail shortly.]
