

#1694 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – Hitler (vs. the U.S.) waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 12, *The Greco-Italian War: Oxi (“No”) Day in Greece on October 28 and its relationship to Epiphany, January 6, 1941*

Key Understanding: The October 28, 1940, attack on Greece by Italy during World War II led to the annual Oxi (“No”) Day celebration in Greece. The event of the October 28, 1940, start of the Greco-Italian War eventually became tied to January 6, 1941, for two reasons:

- (1) **January 6, 1941, the rebuff of Italy in *the Greco-Italian War* – Epiphany, January 6, 1941,** was a key date (as shared in Doc 1 *above*) in the successful Greek counter-attack that forced the Italian army back deep into Albania. The lack of success by the Italians led to Hitler’s German invasion of Greece three months later, on April 6, 1941. The map *below* illustrates the location of the Italian attack (which began on October 28, 1940) in the color *yellow*, and the German attack and advance (which began on April 6, 1941) in the color *rose*.



(2) **January 6, 1941, Churchill’s decision to defend Greece came during the Greco-Italian War** – On Epiphany, January 6, 1941, Churchill told the British chiefs of staff that it would be better to delay exploiting the situation in North Africa in order to help Greece avoid military defeat.
