

#1863 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 122, *An Angel riding in the Whirlwind and directing the Storm: 9-11* also occurred when it did – on September 11, 2001 – because the Assyrian Empire that ended in 612 B.C. had beginnings in 911 B.C.


Ecclesiastes 9:11 is clearly seen in George W. Bush’s quote of John Page.

Ecclesiastes 9:11 (KJV) I returned, and saw under the sun, that the race is not to the swift, nor the battle to the strong, neither yet bread to the wise, nor yet riches to men of understanding, nor yet favour to men of skill; but time and chance happeneth to them all.

In Unsealing [#1861](#), it was learned that the event of 9-11 occurred when it did – on September 11, 2001 – in fulfillment of George W. Bush’s indirect quoting of Ecclesiastes 9:11 in his inaugural address of January 20, 2001.

Nahum 1:3 – which is in the midst of a passage that warns of the Lord’s anger against Nineveh (representing the Assyrian Empire) – is also clearly seen in George W. Bush’s quote of John Page.

Nahum 1:3 (KJV) The LORD is slow to anger, and great in power, and will not at all acquit the wicked: the LORD hath his way in the whirlwind and in the storm, and the clouds are the dust of his feet.



Question: Since Ecclesiastes 9:11 is the *first* part of George W. Bush’s quote of John Page, and points toward 9-11 (the terrorist attacks on New York City on September 11, 2001), does Nahum 1:3, which is the *second* part of George W. Bush’s quote of John Page, also point to 9-11?

Key Understanding #1 and Answer: The answer is *yes*, Nahum 1:3 points to 9-11, through the fact that the Book of Nahum prophesies the fall of Nineveh and the Assyrian Empire, an empire which had *beginnings* in 911 B.C. From the accession of Adad-nirari II in 911 B.C., Assyria pursued a course of expansion and conquest, culminating in mastery over Elam, Mesopotamia, Syria, Palestine, and Egypt. The Assyrian Empire *ended* in 612 B.C., falling to the Babylonians and the Medes. [The next Unsealing is a repeat of Unsealing #1205, about the fall of the Assyrian Empire to the Babylonians and the Medes.]
