

#1884 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 143, *An Angel riding in the Whirlwind and directing the Storm: The Micah 5:5 Assyrian vs. the Micah 5:5 Seven Shepherds, (xvii), Worshipping the moon god Sin*

Key Understanding: The *Senn* part of the Assyrian king Sennacherib's name comes from the moon god *Sin*. The moon god *Sin*, who was generally symbolized by a crescent moon, was worshipped for centuries as a Mesopotamian god, and thus was worshipped by both the Assyrians and the Babylonians. The moon, along with the sun and the visible planets, was thought of as a divine object. The Israelites were warned by the Lord to not worship them as such.



*Deuteronomy 17:1-5 (KJV) Thou shalt not sacrifice unto the LORD thy God any bullock, or sheep, wherein is blemish, or any evilfavouredness: for that is an abomination unto the LORD thy God.
2 If there be found among you, within any of thy gates which the LORD thy God giveth thee, man or woman, that hath wrought wickedness in the sight of the LORD thy God, in transgressing his covenant,
3 And hath gone and served other gods, and worshipped them, either the sun, or **MOON**, or any of the host of heaven, which I have not commanded;
4 And it be told thee, and thou hast heard of it, and enquired diligently, and, behold, it be true, and the thing certain, that such abomination is wrought in Israel:
5 Then shalt thou bring forth that man or that woman, which have committed that wicked thing, unto thy gates, even that man or that woman, and shalt stone them with stones, till they die. [See also Deuteronomy 4:15-19.]*



Often depicted as a wise old man with a long beard, the moon god *Sin* was one of the most important Babylonian gods. His main temples were situated at Ur and Harran. This relief from about 2300 B.C. shows Ur-Nammu, the first king of the third dynasty of Ur, making a sacrifice before *Sin*.
