

#2058 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a second Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 317, Nuremberg Day of Judgment, (xx), The three feasts in the fall month of Tishri, the Feast of Trumpets (Rosh Hashanah), the Feast of the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur), and the Feast of Tabernacles (Sukkot)

Key Understanding #1: The seven Hebrew feasts and sevens. Leviticus chapter 23 details seven (7) Hebrew feasts which take place during the Hebrew calendar year. The Lord's number of *seven* (7) dominates the cycle of religious observances. Every seventh (7th) day was a Sabbath. The seventh (7th) month was a sacred month. Every seventh (7th) year was a Sabbatical year. After 7 x 7 years was the year of Jubilee.

The civil year and religious year in Israel. There are two reckonings of the Hebrew year: the civil year starts in the fall on the first of Tishri (Tishrei); the religious calendar year starts in the spring in the month of Nisan.

Below are the seven (7) Hebrew feasts which take place during the Hebrew calendar year and which are detailed in Leviticus chapter 23.

Three Spring Feasts

(i)	Feast of the Passover	Leviticus 23:4-5
(ii)	Feast of Unleavened Bread	Leviticus 23:6-8
(iii)	Feast of Firstfruits	Leviticus 23:9-14


Fifty days later there is a fourth feast, Pentecost:

(iv)	Feast of Pentecost (Shavuot)	Leviticus 23:15-21
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Three Fall Feasts


(v)	Feast of Trumpets (Rosh Hashanah)	Leviticus 23:23-25
(vi)	Feast of the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur)	Leviticus 23:26-32
(vii)	Feast of Tabernacles (Sukkoth)	Leviticus 23:33-44

Key Understanding #2: The fall feasts. There are three feasts in the fall, in the month of Tishri (Tishrei): (i) the Feast of Trumpets (Rosh Hashanah), which begins on the 1st day of Tishri; (ii) the Feast of the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur), the 10th day of Tishri; and (iii) the Feast of Tabernacles (Sukkoth), which begins on the 15th day of Tishri.

Leviticus 23:26-28 (KJV) And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,
