


#2064 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 323, Nuremberg Day of Judgment, (xxvi), The Assassination of Abraham Lincoln: If Martin Luther King, Jr., was Black Moses, then Abraham Lincoln was also a type of Moses

Key Understanding: *Martin Luther King, Jr., and Abraham Lincoln as Moseses.* Martin Luther King, Jr., was the face of the American Civil Rights movement of the 1950's and 1960's, just as Abraham Lincoln was the face of the U.S. Civil War in the 1860's. And, just as Martin Luther King, Jr., became known as Black Moses, Abraham Lincoln was a type of Moses.

Black Moses and the “Mountaintop” Speech. In Martin Luther King, Jr.'s., famous “Mountaintop” speech (*pictured right*) to striking garbage workers in Memphis, Tennessee, on April 3, 1968, the night before his death, King boldly likened himself to Moses and seemingly foretold of his death prior to the entry of blacks – likened to the Hebrews of old – into the Promised Land:



“I’ve been to the mountaintop . . . I would like to live a long life . . . But I’m not concerned about that now. I just want to do God’s will. And He’s allowed me to go up to the mountain. And I’ve looked over. And I’ve seen the Promised Land. I may not get there with you. But I want you to know tonight, that we, as a people, will get to the Promised Land.”

Moses and the mountaintop. After all of his exploits during the Exodus, and after struggling 40 years in the wilderness leading the constantly complaining and disobedient Israelites, Moses was allowed by the Lord to *see* the Promised Land, but not to *enter* the Promised Land, because of his breaking faith with God in the presence of the Israelites at the waters of Meribah Kadesh in the Desert of Zin (Numbers 20:10-15; Deuteronomy 32:51).

Deuteronomy 34:1-5 (KJV) *And Moses went up from the plains of Moab unto the mountain of Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, that is over against Jericho. And the LORD shewed him all the land of Gilead, unto Dan, 2 And all Naphtali, and the land of Ephraim, and Manasseh, and all the land of Judah, unto the utmost sea,*

3 And the south, and the plain of the valley of Jericho,



the city of palm trees, unto Zoar.

4 And the LORD said unto him, This is the land which I sware unto Abraham, unto Isaac, and unto Jacob, saying, I will give it unto thy seed: I have caused thee to see it with thine eyes, but thou shalt not go over thither.

5 So Moses the servant of the LORD died there in the land of Moab, according to the word of the LORD.
