

#2093 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 352, Nuremberg Day of Judgment, (iv), The Hel Spit: The Battle of Hel opens World War II



Hel Spit. A *spit* is a small, slender point of land that runs into a body of water. One of the most famous spits in the world is **Hel Spit**. The Hel Peninsula is a 36 kilometer long sandy spit situated at the western part of Gdansk Bay in the southern Baltic Sea. It is long, narrow, low, and flat, and characterized by dunes.

Key Understanding #1: The Battle of Hel. The small town of Hel lies at the furthest tip of Hel Peninsula (Hel Spit). The Battle of Hel opened up World War II, with the Germans conducting air strikes against Hel on the very first day of the war. The Battle of Hel was a long battle (September 9 – October 2, 1939), and the Hel Peninsula, together with Hel, was the longest-defended pocket of Polish Army resistance in the initial German invasion.



Key Understanding #2: *God will not be mocked, or spat upon.* The Battle of Hel came at the start of the occupation of Poland and the extermination of several million Jews in Poland. The point is that the Lord ordained Hel Spit to be directly linked to the death of the Jews for the purpose of illustrating that the Lord was not going to be mocked over the mocking of, spitting upon, and striking of his Son, Jesus Christ.
