





#2119 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 378, **The History of the Pale of Settlement, (v), The enlarged Lithuania of the 1300's and 1400's is what eventually constituted the majority of the Pale of Settlement**

Key Understanding: *The growth of Lithuania. A good place to start on understanding what became the Pale of Settlement for the Jews is the growth of Lithuania in the 1300's and 1400's, because it was this enlarged Lithuania that eventually became the Pale of Settlement.*

	Grand Principality of Lithuania, 1240
	Lithuanian conquests by 1340, including the Russian Principalities of Polotsk and Pinsk-Turov
	Ruled by Lithuania in 1462
	Russian Principalities unconquered by Lithuania

Shattered by Mongol invasions, and divided amongst themselves, the Russian Principalities fell easy victims to Lithuanian expansion after 1240.

*Revelation 6:7-8 (KJV) And when he had opened **THE FOURTH SEAL**, I heard the voice of the fourth beast say, Come and see.
