

#2142 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 401, The History of the Pale of Settlement, (xxviii), The Pale of Settlement was officially abolished on April 2, 1917, by the Alexander Kerensky-led democratic Provisional Government

During World War I, the Pale of Settlement lost its rigid hold on the Jewish population when large numbers of Jews fled into the Russian interior to escape the invading German army.

Key Understanding: *The April 2, 1917, official end of the Pale of Settlement.* The advent of World War I brought forth the fall of the Tsarist regime in Russia in March 1917. On April 2, 1917 (New Style), by the law of ‘On the Abolition of Religious and National Restrictions,’ the Pale of Settlement, where most Russian Jews were confined, was abolished (and repressive edicts governing Jewish life were repealed) by Alexander Kerensky’s democratic Provisional Government. A large portion of the Pale would again become a part of Poland with the resurrection of Poland after the war. Alexander Kerensky’s Provisional Government (*Kerensky is pictured on the right*) put an official end to the Pale of Settlement on April 2, 1917. Note that the region of the Pale of Settlement is on the map behind Kerensky.
