


**#2143** The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 402, **The History of the Pale of Settlement, (xxix), During World War II, the Nazis killed at least 1.5 million Jews in the Soviet part of the Pale of Settlement**

**Key Understanding:** *During World War II, the Nazis killed at least 1.5 million Jews in the Soviet Union part of the (former) Pale of Settlement. Even though a surprising number of Jews lived outside of the Pale of Settlement during the time of Tsarist Russia, and even though many Jews spread inland eastward, fleeing the German invasions in both World War I and World War II, the region formerly called the Pale of Settlement held a concentrated population of Jews after the Nazi invasion of the Soviet Union in Operation Barbarossa. The Nazi occupation of the (former) Pale of Settlement would result in the extermination of at least 1.5 million Jews in the Soviet Union alone (reference Unsealing #2108). [Remember, after World War I, much of the Pale of Settlement became modern day Poland.]*



**Nazi-occupied Poland.**  
Over 90% of Polish Jewry, about three (3) million, were killed during the Holocaust (also called Shoah in Hebrew) in Nazi-occupied Poland, along with approximately three (3) million non-Jewish Poles. The Nazi occupation of Poland resulted in the death of one-fifth of the Polish population.

**The Nazi-occupied Soviet Union.**  
One and one-half (1 ½) million Jews were killed in the Nazi-occupied part of the Soviet Union.
