

#2260 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 519, **The Pale Horse, (cxvi), Bringing Death to others, with Hell following for themselves**

*Matthew 26:52 (KJV) Then said Jesus unto him, Put up again thy sword into his place: **FOR ALL THEY THAT TAKE THE SWORD SHALL PERISH WITH THE SWORD.***



*Mark 8:34-35 (KJV) And when he had called the people unto him with his disciples also, he said unto them, **Whoever will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me.** 35 **FOR WHOSEVER WILL SAVE HIS LIFE SHALL LOSE IT;** but whosoever shall lose his life for my sake and the gospel's, the same shall save it.*

Review (from the previous Unsealing): *The sword vs. the cross.* The most significant and proper spiritual meaning behind the Lord's words "for all they that take the sword shall perish with the sword" (Matthew 26:52) is explained by and related to the very essence of Christianity and cross-carrying, "for whosoever will save his life shall lose it." The sword is the ultimate representative of "saving your life," and thus the representative of "losing it" eternally.



Key Understanding: *Bringing death to others, with hell following for themselves.* Thus, when proper spiritual insight is given to the subject matter of the various forms of sword-bearing 'Christian' Pale Horse Riders, it is clear that a major interpretation (of the layered interpretations) of the Revelation 6:7-8 Pale Horse Rider is that those of the Pale Horse Rider bring Death to others, with Hell following, for themselves.



*Revelation 6:8 (KJV) **And I looked, and behold A PALE HORSE: and his name that sat on him was DEATH, AND HELL FOLLOWED WITH HIM.** And power was given unto them over **THE FOURTH PART OF THE EARTH, TO KILL (i) WITH SWORD,** and (ii) with hunger, and (iii) with death, and (iv) with the beasts of the earth.*
