

#2404 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 663, **Building the Christian-Jewish-Arab Temple, (xlii), Allenby’s World War I capture of Jerusalem is also as a counterfeit *coming of the Lord*, which is why the last fighting occurred on the Mount of Olives**

In the capture of Jerusalem during World War I by the army of Edmund Allenby on December 9, 1917, the last fighting took place on the Mount of Olives.

Key Understanding: *The Day of the Lord and the Mount of Olives.* The last fighting took place on the Mount of Olives in the capture of Jerusalem on December 9, 1917, because it represented a *counterfeit* of the Day of the Lord seen in Zechariah 14:4. Just as the victor in the Civil War represented the bringing forth of *the coming of the Lord*, the victors in World War I represented the same.

*Zechariah 14:1-4 (KJV) Behold, the day of the LORD cometh, and thy spoil shall be divided in the midst of thee.
2 For I will gather all nations against Jerusalem to battle; and the city shall be taken, and the houses rifled, and the women ravished; and half of the city shall go forth into captivity, and the residue of the people shall not be cut off from the city.
3 Then shall the LORD go forth, and fight against those nations, as when he fought in the day of battle.*

STAND IN THAT DAY UPON THE MOUNT OF OLIVES, which is before Jerusalem on the east, and the mount of Olives shall cleave in the midst thereof toward the east and toward the west, and there shall be a very great valley; and half of the mountain shall remove toward the north, and half of it toward the south.
