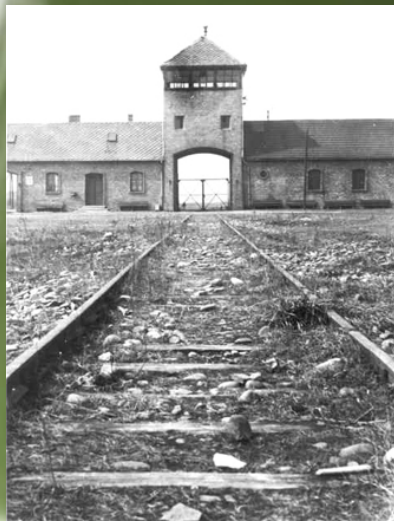


#2533 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 792, **Green Jews, (viii), Hurting the Greenspan Jews**

On November 7, 1938, 17-year-old Herschel Grynszpan, in response to his parents' deportation from Germany to Poland, assassinated a Nazi embassy worker in Paris. This triggered Kristallnacht of November 9-10, 1938, an event that many consider to represent the real beginning of the Holocaust.



Key Understanding #1: *Hurting the Greenspan Jews.* The Lord’s ordainment of Herschel Greenspan to fulfill his role as the assassin that sparked Kristallnacht – an event that is often considered a beginning of the Holocaust – was/is for the purpose of connecting the themes of

(a) *not hurting any green thing* and

(b) *those who were sealed, or not sealed, of God in their foreheads,*

which are found in the *combination* of the passages of Revelation 7:1-4 (and specifically Revelation 7:3-4) and Revelation 9:1-4 (and specifically Revelation 9:4).

Revelation 7:3-4 (KJV) Saying, Hurt not the earth, neither the sea, nor the trees, till we have sealed the servants of our God in their foreheads.

4 And I heard the number of them which were sealed: and there were sealed an hundred and forty and four thousand of all the tribes of the children of Israel.

Revelation 9:4 (KJV) And it was commanded them that they should not hurt the grass of the earth, NEITHER ANY GREEN THING, neither any tree; BUT ONLY THOSE MEN WHICH HAVE NOT THE SEAL OF GOD IN THEIR FOREHEADS.

Key Understanding #2: *Hurting the Greenspan Jews.* However, the Lord ordained the ‘Greenspan’ Jews to be ‘hurt’ – actually slaughtered by the millions – to show that though they would be masquerading as *green*, and thus they should *not* be hurt, they were instead in the category of “*those men which have not the seal of the God in their foreheads.*”
