

#2616 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 875, **The Palm Christians, (vi), Striking Jesus with the Palms of their Hands**

Revelation 7:9-10 (KJV) After this I beheld, and, lo, a great multitude, which no man could number, of all nations, and kindreds, and people, and tongues, stood before the throne, and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, **AND PALMS IN THEIR HANDS;**
10 And cried with a loud voice, saying, Salvation to our God which sitteth upon the throne, and unto the Lamb.

Key Understanding #1: Palm Sunday. The first theme surrounding palms and hands appears in John 12:12-15.

John 12:12-15 (KJV) On the next day much people that were come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem,
13 **TOOK BRANCHES OF PALM TREES,** and went forth to meet him, and cried, Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh in the name of the Lord.

14 And Jesus, when he had found a young ass, sat thereon; as it is written,
15 Fear not, daughter of Sion: behold, thy King cometh, sitting on an ass's colt.



Key Understanding #2: Striking Jesus with the palms of their hands. A second theme surrounding palms and hands appears in Mark 14:63-65 (KJV).

Mark 14:63-65 (KJV) Then the high priest [Caiaphas] rent his clothes, and saith, What need we any further witnesses?

64 Ye have heard the blasphemy: what think ye? And they all condemned him to be guilty of death.

65 **AND SOME BEGAN TO SPIT ON HIM,** and to cover his face, and to buffet him,

and to say unto him, Prophecy: and **THE SERVANTS DID STRIKE HIM WITH THE PALMS OF THEIR HANDS.**
