

#2676 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 935, **The Palm Christians, (Ixvi), Repeat of the content of Unsealing #2646 about the various time periods of “a Little Season”**

**Key Understanding:** There are varying time periods that serve as fulfillments of “a little season” in Revelation 6:11 for the *true* tribulation saints as well as for the paralleling great multitude *counterfeit* tribulation saints.

1. The time from the American Revolutionary War to the present serves as the longer time period of “a little season”.
2. The time from the rise of the Soviet Union and the advent of the Cold War to the present serves as a shorter time period of “a little season”.
3. Each of the time periods (a) from the June 3-4, 1989, event at Tiananmen Square in Beijing to the present, (b) from the November 9-10, 1989, fall of the Berlin Wall to the present, and (c) from the December 8-10, 1991, fall of the Soviet Union to the present serves as a short, short time period of “a little season”.

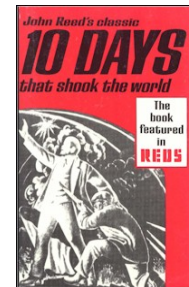
The American Revolutionary War to the present serves as the longer time period of “a little season”
