

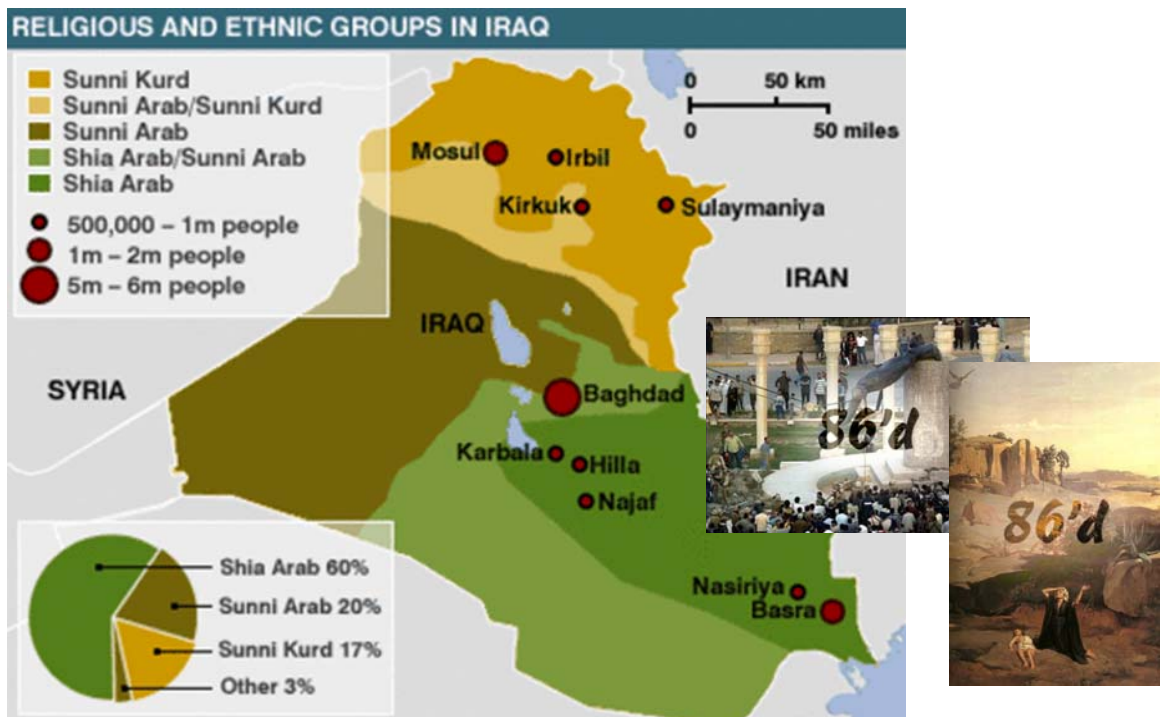
#2762 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 1021, **Palm Beach to Judging Pretender Babylon, (Ixiii), Why the number 86 – representing the seed of Ishmael – is specifically connected to the Great Multitude and the judgment upon *pretender* Babylon the Great**

Key Understanding: 86'ing the Sunni Arab-dominated regime of Saddam Hussein. The first reason – though not the *ultimate* reason – why the number 86, represented through the 86 years between the April 6 [= 9], 1917, U.S. entry into World War I and the April 9, 2003, fall of Baghdad, is specifically connected to the Great Multitude and the judgment upon *pretender* Babylon the Great (the regime of Saddam Hussein in Iraq) is because the physical seed of Ishmael – Arabs – make up the majority of Iraq's ethnic population. Therefore, the 86 years, in combination with the fact that Abram was 86 years old when Ishmael was born, represented the 86'ing of the Sunni Arab-dominated regime of Saddam Hussein on April 9, 2003.

The make-up of Iraq

Ethnic groups: **Arab 75%-80%**, Kurdish 15%-20%, Turkoman, Assyrian, or other 5%

Religions: Muslim 97% (Shi'a 60%-65%, Sunni 32%-37%), Christian or other 3%
