

#2840 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 1099, Jackson Wild Ass Men, (xxv), 188 years between Andrew Jackson’s January 8, 1815, victory at the Battle of New Orleans and the March 19, 2003, start of the Jackson War against the regime of Saddam Hussein

Andrew Jackson and the January 8, 1815, Battle of New Orleans. The Battle of New Orleans took place on January 8, 1815, and was the last major battle of the War of 1812, the ‘second American war for independence’ from Great Britain. American forces, with General Andrew Jackson in command, defeated an invading British army intent on seizing New Orleans and America’s vast western lands. The Treaty of Ghent that ended the war had already been signed on December 24, 1814, but news of the peace would not reach New Orleans until February.

Key Understanding: *From Andrew Jackson’s victory to end the War of 1812 to the ‘Jackson’ start of the ‘Jackson’ Iraq War.* There were 188 years (+ 2 months and 11 days) between Andrew Jackson’s January 8, 1815, victory at the Battle of New Orleans and the March 19, 2003, start of the Jackson War against the regime of Saddam Hussein. The 188 years were in fulfillment of Revelation 18:8, only as the *counterfeit*, to warn of the *real*. This is explained further in the next Unsealing.
